

## Narrative

CHASE Africa is committed to the goals set out by FP2030 to achieve universal access to sexual and reproductive healthcare services and rights (SRHR). As an organisation our mission is to enable access to family planning, healthcare and rights, while protecting the environment and building resilience to climate change. We consider our work critical in achieving FP 2030 objectives that would lead to an improvement in lives and livelihoods of women, men, young people, and the communities they are part of. As such, CHASE Africa has made the following commitment towards the realisation of the FP2030 goals:

- Address Sexual and Reproductive Health and Rights (SRHR) and the unmet need for family planning.
- Improve Adolescent SRHR outcomes.
- Partner With Communities and Stakeholders.
- Strengthen Health Systems.
- Integrate SRHR and community health into other programmes working in rural areas.

## Outcomes & Values

- Over 1 million attendances at information and behavioral change communication sessions on Sexual and Reproductive Health and Rights (including door-to-door visits by CHWs, dialogues, information provision at mobile outreaches)
- 500,000 attendances by adolescents and youth (10-24 years old) at sessions that provide information on SRHRs, both in and out of school, through child rights clubs, school closing events, and Youth Peer Mentors
- Uptake of at least 250,000 family planning services, with over 40% provided to First Time Users (FTU) of modern contraception.
- Uptake of at least 60,000 other Sexual and Reproductive Health Services (including HIV testing and counselling; ARVs; cancer screening (cervical, breast and prostate); antenatal and postnatal appointments; abortion information and post-abortion care, treatment of sexual GBV
- Uptake of at least 350,000 basic healthcare services particularly targeted at women and children, to improve maternal, neo-natal, child and adolescent health.

Amongst the communities that CHASE Africa's partners work, it aims to achieve:

- 20% increase in the proportion of women of childbearing age who make their own informed decisions regarding sexual relations, contraceptive use and reproductive health care.
- 25% increase in the proportion of the population with basic knowledge about SRHR
